

Disaster Relief and the Gospel

Disaster relief is viewed as an act of faith in practise, where the practical aid provided through churches and other Christian organisations like us (EHC) is seen as a tangible expression of the Gospel.



This approach is rooted in the biblical principle that faith without works (James 2:17) is dead, leading believers to engage in both physical and spiritual support, demonstrating God's love and hope through actions like rebuilding schools, providing aid and offering support and pastoral care through projects such as our water wells, prison ministry and child sponsorships.



The theological and biblical basis demonstrated through our action is making disaster relief a vital component of Christian discipleship. The New Testament book of Acts provides an example of early Christians gathering resources to help fellow believers in need during a famine, establishing a precedent for providing aid to those suffering.



Disaster preparation and relief efforts present opportunities for Christians to proactively connect with and serve their neighbours.


It is for this reason I am pleased to advise that we have set up a Disaster Relief Fund with a view to building up funds that would be used to support our neighbours (Matt 22:39) - such was the case with the recent floods in Pakistan. The heavy monsoon rains caused severe flooding across Pakistan, submerging a third of the country, destroying villages, crops, roads and displacing millions of people. The disaster resulted in widespread humanitarian need, with homes, livelihoods and infrastructure heavily impacted. Last year, your generous donations to the devasting landslides in the Enga Province in Papua New Guinea resulted in us providing food, clothing and equipment for surviving villagers.

This month, our newsletter focuses on Pakistan, where Rev. Imran Masqood shares an update on the important work taking place on the ground to support communities affected by the recent floods. ... Bringing Acts Chapters 13-21 Alive

Last month 27 Christian brothers and sisters completed a gruelling 17 days journey in the **Footsteps of Apostle Paul** covering Greece and Turkey.

The pilgrimage traced the missionary journeys of Apostle Paul throughout Greece and Turkey visiting significant biblical sites where Paul preached, taught and established early Christian communities allowing us to gain a deeper understanding of his impact on Christianity.



Paul's travels played a crucial role in the formation and development of the early Christian church and many of the communities he encountered on these missionary journeys were the same ones he wrote to in his pastoral epistles.

by connecting with the historical and geographical context of his missionary work. For us, it offered a spiritual enrichment through immersive pilgrimage, prayer and reflection in significant biblical locations, making scripture more real and personal.

I am personally grateful for all those who assisted with devotionals (Alex Thomas), singing (Reggie John) and for those who helped with the daily bible reading at each destination. In short, it was pleasing to have Paul teach us that the messianic prophecies were fulfilled in Christ.

Pakistan Floods 2025

In mid-2025, Pakistan was hit by devastating floods during an unusually intense monsoon season. Regions including Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Punjab, Sindh, Balochistan and Gilgit-Baltistan suffered torrential rains, landslides and rising rivers. By mid-September, the floods had caused 946 deaths (255 children), injured over 1,000 people and affected more than a million lives. In Punjab alone, around 5 million people were impacted, with thousands of villages submerged and vast farmland damaged.



Who Were Significantly Affected: Christian Minorities

Pakistan's Christian minority, already vulnerable due to social, economic and geographic marginalisation, has been severely affected. In the Punjab region near Faisalabad, around 50 Christian families lost their brick and mud homes and took refuge in a surviving church. In villages near Quetta, Christian agricultural workers lost both homes and livelihoods, as basic houses in narrow flood-prone valleys were destroyed. Remote communities in Sindh also saw homes, belongings and incomes washed away, leaving many families sleeping outside with little shelter or means to recover.



Relief Efforts and Responses

Members of the Christian community, churches and charities have played an important role in relief efforts. Churches, schools and parishes have been used as shelters for displaced families. Local parishes in Pakistan have distributed food, clean water, hygiene kits and other essentials to all affected. Christian organisations have also supported the hardest-hit families by providing tents, mosquito nets and medical aid

Challenges and Ongoing Needs

While relief continues, major challenges persist:

- Many Christian families live in remote, under-resourced areas where weak infrastructure hinders rescue, aid delivery and communication.
- Churches and temporary shelters are overcrowded and only suitable shortterm; secure long-term housing is urgently needed.
- Clean water, sanitation, healthcare and disease prevention remain limited and waterborne illnesses continue to pose serious risks.

Looking Ahead

As floodwaters recede, Christian communities will need continued support: Rebuilding homes in safer, less flood-prone areas.

- Restoring livelihoods for agricultural and day-labour workers.
- Improving access to healthcare, education and infrastructure in remote regions.
- Ensuring relief is inclusive and equitable for vulnerable religious minorities.

50th Anniversary Prayer Breakfast

On 22 October 2025, parliamentary, community and church leaders gathered at NSW Parliament House for a special Prayer Breakfast commemorating the 50th Anniversary of Every Home for Christ (EHC) in Australia. The event marked five decades of Christian mission, prayer ministry, humanitarian aid and community outreach across Australia and the nations.

A motion to acknowledge the occasion was formally given in the Legislative Council by The Hon. Susan Carter MLC, noting the significance of the milestone and commending Every Home for Christ for its ongoing work in sharing the Gospel and providing practical care to communities in need.



The motion read in part:

That this House commends Every Home for Christ for their decades of Christian mission and philanthropic outreach.

Celebrating Tonga—Australia Friendship

September 2025 marked a momentous chapter in the enduring friendship between the Kingdom of Tonga and Australia. Their Majesties King Tupou VI and Queen Nanasipau'u visited as Official High-Level Guests of the Australian Government to celebrate two historic milestones: Fifty-Five Years of Diplomatic Relations between the two nations and The Golden Jubilee of the Consulate-General of Tonga in Australia, first led by Honorary Consul-General Bill Waterhouse and later by his daughter Louise Waterhouse.



The week-long State visit began with a formal ceremonial welcome at Government House, Yarralumla, hosted by the Governor-General of Australia. This was followed by the signing of a Statement of Intent, Kaume 'a Ofi — meaning "close friendship" — by Tonga's High Commissioner, His Excellency Curtis Tu'ihalangingie and Australia's High Commissioner to Tonga, His Excellency Brek Batley. The signing symbolised a renewed commitment to cooperation, shared democratic values and mutual respect between the two Pacific neighbours.

A highlight of the visit was the Choral Service of Thanksgiving at Sydney's historic



St Stephen's Church, organised by the Uniting Church in Australia and led by Reverend Charissa Sul, President of the Uniting Church. More than I,000 worshippers attended the service, joined by a combined choir of 408 singers—including 80 who travelled from Queensland—to perform a breathtaking rendition of Handel's Zadok the Priest. Among the dignitaries present was Her Excellency the Hon. Margaret Beazley AC KC, Governor of New South Wales, who remarked afterwards that she "felt the roof explode" in celebration and praise.



The week's culminating event took place at the NSW Parliament House, where the Hon. Ben Franklin MLC, President of the Legislative Council, hosted a Commemorative Reception in honour of Their Majesties.

The event marked both the Golden Jubilee of the Consulate-General and the Fifty-Five Years of Diplomatic Relations, bringing together government leaders, diplomats and community representatives from across the Pacific.

At Parliament House, guests were invited to tour a major historical exhibition, Tonga and New South Wales: A 200-Year Connection, curated by the Australian Museum, which traced the deep cultural, educational and spiritual bonds between Tonga and Australia—from early missionary ties and student exchanges to contemporary development partnerships.

The occasion also featured the official launch of Louise Waterhouse's memoirs, Driving Three Kings: Fifty Years of the Waterhouse Family Serving the Kingdom of Tonga. The book chronicles the Waterhouse family's half-century of service and friendship with Tonga's monarchy, offering personal anecdotes, historical insight and candid reflections on Tonga's modern journey. It stands as both a record of service and a testament to the trust shared between the Waterhouse family and three successive Tongan monarchs—Their Majesties King Taufa'ahau Tupou IV, King George Tupou V, and King Tupou VI.

Following on from the visit will be a celebration in Tonga of a new partnership born of faith and compassion. A special joint

initiative will be announced between Her Majesty Queen Nanasipau'u's charity in Tonga and Every Home for Christ Australia, who will deliver Audio Bibles and a Mobile Medical Unit to serve remote island communities.

The Audio Bible project—coordinated by Greg Bondar, Kevin Keegan and supported by Kaliopi Diamantis had Rev. Jason Kioa and Mrs Fotolina Kioa kindly volunteering their voices and time to record the Bible narration.

EHC Ministry Director, Greg Bondar will travel to Tonga to handover 500 Audio Bibles and officially launch the initiative on Tonga Day, 4 November 2025, coinciding with the 150th Anniversary of the Tongan Constitution. That milestone recalls the visionary leadership of King Tupou I, whose 1875 Constitution safeguarded the sovereignty and dignity of his people, ensuring Tonga remained the only nation in the Pacific never to be colonised.

As the celebrations drew to a close, the events of September 2025 stood as a powerful reaffirmation of the "Kaume 'a Ofi" spirit — a bond of close friendship that continues to unite Tonga and Australia in mutual respect, faith and shared purpose.






