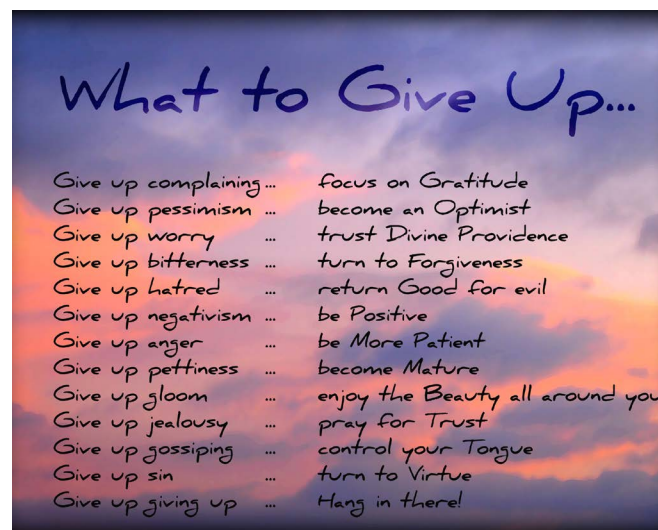
Christians in different church traditions around the world celebrate slightly different periods of Lent. Some church buildings are made to look plainer during Lent with flowers and other decorations removed.

Our thoughts and prayers are extended to his family, his ministry staff and everyone connected to him in fulfilling the Great Commission.

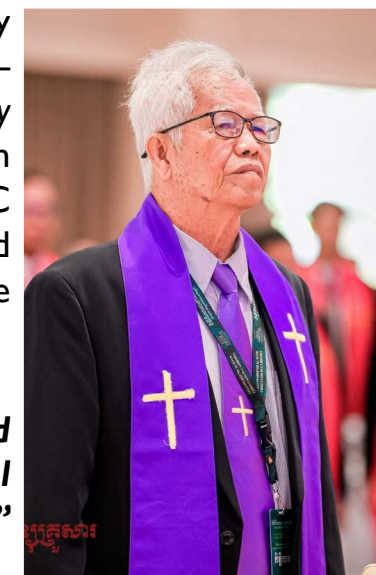

Introducing the V.O.T.E. Project: Vocational Training for Rural Women and Employment

In the rural districts of Thoothukudi and Kovilpatti in Tamil Nadu, India, many families face daily challenges shaped by poverty, limited education and restricted access to employment. The **V.O.T.E. Project - Vocational Training for Rural Women and Employment** has been created to help break this cycle by equipping women with practical skills, financial knowledge and community support systems that lead to sustainable livelihoods and stronger communities.

The project will be implemented across five villages within the Kulasegaranallur Panchayat, located approximately 35 kilometres from Thoothukudi. These villages are home to around 3,300 people, including a significant youth population. The communities rely heavily on agriculture and government employment schemes, such as the 100-day job program. However, unpredictable monsoon rains and limited work opportunities mean many households struggle to secure consistent income throughout the year. Most women, in particular, remain confined to their villages with few opportunities to develop employable skills or access wider markets.

A large proportion of the population belongs to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities, including Dalits, who continue to face social and economic disadvantage. According to the Global Multidimensional Poverty Index, millions in these communities experience deprivation in education, health and living standards, reinforcing the urgent need for long-term, skills-based solutions.



The V.O.T.E. Project responds directly to these challenges by focusing on vocational training as a pathway out of poverty. Its primary emphasis is on training women in tailoring, a practical and locally relevant skill with strong employment potential. Several garment factories operate nearby, creating opportunities for job placement, while home-based and group-led tailoring services offer options for women who prefer to work within their communities.

Alongside technical training, participants will receive financial literacy and small business education. This includes learning how to save, manage income and develop sustainable micro-enterprises. Exposure visits and training sessions with



experienced business owners and agriculture experts will provide practical insight into successful business models and build confidence to pursue employment or entrepreneurship.

A key feature of the project is the formation and revitalisation of **Self-Help Groups (SHGs)** within the villages. These



accessibility wherever possible. Environmental care is woven into project delivery through hygiene, sanitation and environmental awareness campaigns conducted in partnership with local educational institutions.



groups create a foundation for collective saving, low-interest community loans and mutual support. Through SHGs, participants can access small business loans to start or expand ventures such as tailoring services, soap making and nutrition product preparation. This community-led approach ensures that financial resources continue to circulate locally, even after the project period ends.

V.O.T.E. is designed to be sustainable. Women with disabilities are encouraged to participate and training locations will be selected to ensure

The overall goal of the V.O.T.E. Project is to increase income and improve living standards across the Kulasegaranallur Panchayat. By strengthening skills, supporting small businesses and empowering community groups, the project aims to create lasting change that benefits not only individual women but their families and entire villages.

Through Vocational Training for Rural Women and Employment, V.O.T.E. offers more than skills, it provides opportunity, dignity and a pathway toward a more secure and hopeful future. Prayers welcome.

Zambia Food Security and Outreach Project Women Changing Lives

Zambian Food security project identifies women as key agents for achieving economic and social changes in the communities given their large presence in the community and their involvement in agriculture initiatives, businesses, environmental programs and social related programs in the Kazala area. The project's support and empowering of women in these initiatives does not only improve their individual families but also overall productivity in the community they live in.



Economic Involvement

With technical and financial support from **Every Home Global Concern Australia**, the project has been training women in agriculture production, business management and environmental management to equip them with skills to pursue new technologies and remain resilient to environmental challenges. These women are later empowered with agriculture farming inputs, livestock,



support them to access small village loans from the project village banking clubs initiatives and link them to seed companies who use their field crops as marketing tools to showcase company seed productivity. With this support from the project, 30% of vulnerable women have made significant economic transformation and social improvements in the last 10 years.



Sara rears broiler chickens every 5 months cycle for business, while Veronica runs a vegetable garden which earns her and her family K300 per month. Iness and Peggy now cultivate about 3 ha of grain each and every year for home consumption and to sell. These women do not only earn income and provide food for themselves and families but they also supply fresh food products for sale within reach in their respective communities. They have also created employment opportunities in their



local community for people who do part time work in their businesses and crop field. With continued support from the project and Every Home Global Concern, it is expected that the number of women achieving positive economic transformation and social changes will continue to increase progressively toward sustainability.



Water & Sanitation Involvement

The involvement and inclusion of women by the project and community in planning, design and management of newly rehabilitated water points in villages has proved that services of these water points are well maintained and meet specific needs of the community. Nine out of ten households in villages rely on women and girls to fetch water for home use. Their contribution in planning, design and management of newly rehabilitated water points has made a huge difference in maintaining service delivery.



Leadership Involvement

The Zambia project has been advocating for gender balance in appointments of leaders to occupy decision making positions in the community. 55% of influential leadership positions in the food security and outreach program village committees are held by women who have fully participated in shaping laws, strategies, policies and programs which positively affect the smooth running of the project in the community for the past 10 years.

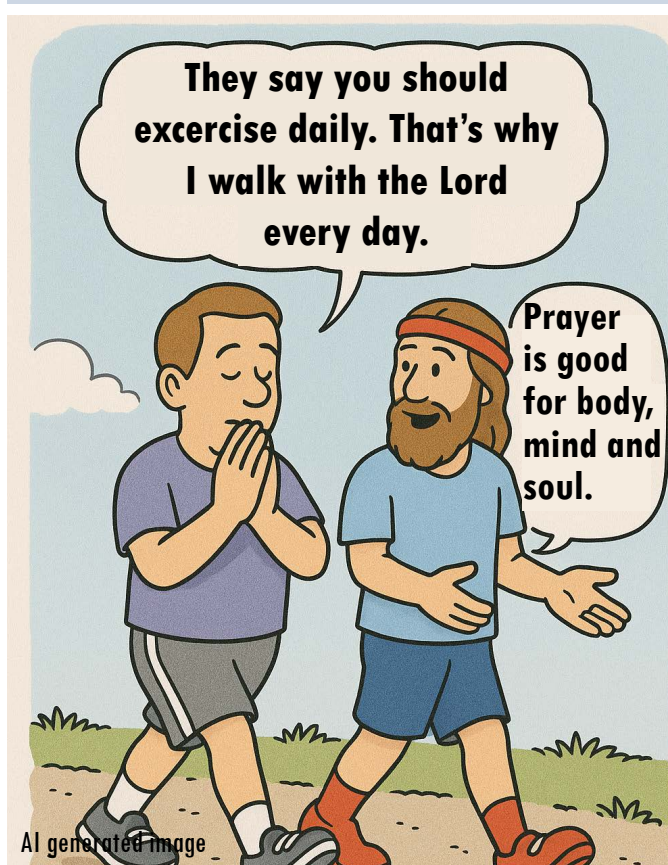
